

Europe Unit Project - You Tell the Story!

Application of Knowledge - Chapters 11-13

For our European Unit, each student will choose a topic relating to the continent of Europe. Then they will **narrate the story** using either a PPT/Keynote Presentation, or using iMovie. Students are encouraged to incorporate video clips as well as still pictures with their presentation, but they are not required.

- Choose **ANY** of the countries of Europe for the subject of your presentation
- Pick your topic! Politics, Culture, Economics, Geography (**choose only ONE**)
- Use iMovie, Keynote, PPT or other presentation that you can record over
- Research information about your topic using the textbook and internet - **make sure you put them in your own words!**
- Gather pictures and video clips (if possible) to use in your presentation
- Record your information over the pictures and slides
- Make sure you cite your research with a bibliography using APA or MLA
- Presentation should last between 2-5 minutes in length, and should be about 10 slides long when finished

We will work in the computer lab for 3 days. The project will be due by next Tuesday (November 2nd) by classtime!
