7th Grade will construct a "Historical" Wall in honor of the people of Berlin whose freedoms and rights were stolen from them.

My Group's Topic is (circle one) WWI WWII Cold War European Union

The group will do the following:

1) Record the causes and effects of your topic. The cause and effect information needs to be organized by sequence of the events you deem as important. These events need to be discussed and agreed on within the group. Each person will type up their part to add to your piece of the wall. Label the causes and effects.

Example: One **cause** of WWI was military build up during the industrial revolution

Effects - countries around Europe got very nervous and started to form alliances amongst themselves

- This led to a lot of tension throughout Europe

I am responsible for the beginning, middle or ending events (circle one)

Each group needs to make the following clear- why your topic was started
Why did the US get involved
How did your topic come to an end

2) Each person in the group will be responsible for writing a detailed paragraph for **one** of the following questions;

A. How did the power structure change during, within or after your time period?

B. How was the economy a part of your topic/conflict?

C. How did geography impact or play a part in your topic or historical event?

D. What "walls" went up during or as a result of your historical event?

3) Each member of the group will take their "piece" of the wall home and graffiti something symbolic or that symbolizes your topic and include a written explanation of what you graffitied and why.

4) Each group will present your information to the class and will be responsible for helping your classmates understand your topic of European History as well as be evaluated by your peers. Be prepared to defend why you chose the cause and effect information that you chose and to go head to head against another group of students with the same topic.
